

Parish Council Round Up

Road Safety in Keyingham

Council members were very disappointed to receive notification that the public meeting scheduled for the 26th March to be hosted by ERYC Highways and Planning Teams would need to be rearranged due to illness.

Members were looking forward to the long-anticipated presentations of the proposed plans for adaptations to the crossing at the heart of the village and accompanying signage, road markings and speed restrictions to address the serious concerns regarding safety of all road users.

The Parish Council have been assured that this meeting will be rescheduled as soon as possible and will be publicised widely as soon as the arrangements are notified. A letter of apology from Paul Tripp, ERYC has been reproduced in full on page 4.

Keyingham Primary School Student Council

At the March meeting of the Parish Council members elected new representatives to serve as Trustees for the Marritt Ombler Charity.

The Charity was registered with

the Charities Commission in 1980 to help people under 25, including people with disabilities, living in, or educated in Keyingham, with education and training, sports and skills and to further their social development. The Charity draws its income from donations, interest from investments and rent from land.

Examples of the types of support include help with travel to University or College, specialist education and training, learning materials and equipment. The Trustees would like to encourage people to consider applying to this fund and will give careful, individual and confidential consideration to each application.

(extract from Update From Inspector Andrew Beadman)

Anti-social behaviour is, generally speaking, the younger generation coming together and causing issues. The impact of these incidents on residents and our communities should not be underestimated and I want to ensure people know and understand just what we are doing to combat ASB. (If you witness ASB then inform the police to ensure that they are aware of the events. Ed.) Part of proactive policing is engaging

with the communities to try to understand their concerns, and this applies to the younger generations, too. We want to avoid kids in our area slipping into criminal activities, so it is important they feel heard. I enjoy working with partner agencies and making a difference by working together as a team to tackle and prevent issues such as anti-social behaviour.
