Parish Council Round Up - July

Road Safety in Keyingham

As a follow up to the public meeting held on 11th May members of ERYC highways team including two Traffic Management Engineers, the Group Manager for Technical Services and Cllr Claire Holmes, attended the July meeting of the Parish Council. The first hour of the meeting was dedicated to providing further clarification and answering Parish Councillors questions on the proposals previously presented. The traffic management officers agreed to provide analysis of the additional traffic surveys which is now underway. It was agreed that a decision regarding the actions to improve the safety of the crossing, would be taken, based on the outcomes of the second survey and the recommendations of specialist officers.

Keyingham Primary School Student Council

On Friday 19th July representatives of the Parish Council attended a special Assembly led by the Student Council. Year six student councillors read the Student Council Annual Report which they had compiled based on the feedback form each of the year groups. Student Council members celebrated the successful delivery of projects throughout the year and received a huge vote of thanks from the Vice Chairman, Cllr Mel Smith who commented on how much the Parish Council had enjoyed working with them.

Cllr Smith delivered the Platinum Jubilee Souvenir Pens which were distributed to all pupils, and The Parish Clerk led a very well – deserved round of applause for the work of the Student Council throughout the year. Antisocial Behaviour on the Village Green

Over the last two months, particularly during better weather the Parish Council has received repeated complaints regarding persistent antisocial behaviour on the Garth, including noise very late into the night, drinking alcohol and littering. Mr Kellington, our Litter Picker, now visits the area daily and each time there are disturbances in the area the police have been informed.

The Council advises that residents continue to report *each* and *every incident* to the Police to help build a record of instances as this directly affects the frequency of police patrols to the area. Cllr Hoggard is leading on exploring solutions which include specially designed noise deterrents and altering the layout of the seating and planting. If you have suggestions on how to tackle this difficult and persistent issue please email the Clerk or contact Cllr Hoggard directly.

Cemetery

Due to the persistent problem of rabbits destroying the plants in the troughs along the path the Council will be considering options to try to preserve the planting. Cllr Lawton is leading on exploring options to preserve the beauty of area which is frequently complemented by visitors.
