

Parish Council 'Round-up' October November

Road Safety in Keyingham

Following on from the vote to accept the proposal for improvements to the Road Crossing, Parish Councillors considered the proposals for the Safety signage to the east and west of the village where the village boundary transects the Main A1033 Hull to Withernsea Road. The next stage in this part of the overall project will be to hold a site meeting with ERYC Traffic Management Officers to agree the positioning of the signs. A meeting was scheduled for 23rd November but was unfortunately cancelled due to illness and will be rearranged as soon as possible. ERYC Traffic Management and Planning Teams have pledged their support in helping to agree the most suitable positions for the signs at each end of the village and will also oversee the works for putting them in place.

Antisocial Behaviour on the Village Green and Saltaugh Road Playing Field.

Applications for funding to follow up on the recommendations made by the ERYC Antisocial Behaviour Officer have now been submitted and we are awaiting the

outcome of the bidding round. If successful the Parish Council will focus the funding on additional lighting, CCTV cameras and other deterrents. Keep an eye on the PC website for updates.

Remembrance Sunday "Lest We Forget"

Thank you to everyone who joined in the Service of Remembrance at St Nicholas Church followed by the laying of wreathes, tributes and prayers for peace in the Church Grounds. Once wreathes were laid on behalf of each of the Armed Services, The Royal British Legion, The Lord Lieutenant of Holderness, The Parish Council, The Church, Keyingham Guides, The Vintage Machinery Club and a number of personal tributes in memory of those whose lives were lost in in theatres of war as well as whose lives were changed by injury or illness. A Trumpeter played the last post, the union flag was lowered, and two minutes silence was observed at 11.00 to quietly remember and give thanks for their service and for our lives lived in peace.

Repairs to the Play Equipment Saltaugh Road Amenity Area.

Following the Play Inspection Company's assessment of the to playing fields on Saltaugh and Eastfield Roads tenders were sought for repairs and the contract awarded. The programme of repairs and replacement is almost complete and all the pieces of equipment that were highlighted as requiring attention will be 'brought up to scratch' by the beginning of December.

Keyingham Village Hall

Over the past few months, the Village Hall Committee have been meeting frequently to consider haw best to ensure the future financial viability of the hall. Whilst the Village Hall is independent of the Parish Council the Parish Council recognises the need to maintain a community hall as an asset for use by the residents of Keyingham.

Following on from two lockdowns and subsequent changes in the patterns of use, the hall has suffered reduced income and needs to consider ways to engage new user groups. As part of this overall picture the Parish Council is investigating ways to provide support which include bidding for funds to carry out repairs.

Boyes Lane Recreation Ground Charity

Councillors, Trustees and Working Group Members are moving ahead with plans to establish areas of 'wildflower meadow' and by sowing yellow rattle to help create the right environment for the wildflower seeds to germinate. The creation of a 'Bog Garden' to encourage frogs, newts and dragonflies is underway and wooden structures no longer in use have been removed in favour of 'green space'. At the November meeting Councillors agreed to match fund a bid for a small number of established fruit trees as the first stage in the creation of a 'Community Orchard'.

The next scheduled meeting of the PC is 7.00pm on Tuesday 20th December 2022 in Keyingham Village Hall (Main Hall) **Public participation is always** welcome.
