Keyingham Village Hall kept open by DIFEY Grant

A grant from the East Riding of Yorkshire "Do It For East Yorkshire Community Grant Fund allowed the Village Hall Committee to replace the Boiler and ensured that the Village Hall could remain open after the Old Boiler was condemned. Thanks must also go to Adam Lansdell and the staff of A S Total Gas Services who undertook the work.

Further opportunities arose from the grant funding. The Village Hall committee will be showing 3 films in February and March further details are on front page

There will also be a Warm Welcome Cuppa sessions each Friday afternoon between 14:00 and 16:00 starting on the 27th January.

These events are free to villagers during February and March and it hoped that interest will be such that we can continue the events. Your support is needed. While the boiler was being fitted

volunteers painted the storeroom walls and floor. The committee would like to thank these volunteers for their hard work.

A license has been applied for from the ERYC to run a lottery in the village. If the license is granted the project will be called the 200 club. The aim is for 200 people to pay £2 a month for a place in a monthly draw. This will give them the opportunity to win one of three monetary prizes every month, with the proceeds going to support the village hall. More details will be supplied when the license is granted. It is hoped that the start date will be the end of March.

The coffee morning Wednesdays 10:00 to 11:30 has started again and will take place during school term time. Giving the opportunity for a good chat over tea or coffee and cakes

A stipulation for the grant was that the parish council has to provide feedback on the success of the events and suggestion for further use of the venue.

To this end you will be asked to complete a questionnaire when attending an event.

The village hall committee are working hard to make the events a success, however the events will

only succeed if villagers support these events and volunteer to help.

Parish Council 'Round-up' December 2022 - January 2023

Road Safety in Keyingham

The site meeting to discuss the positioning of Road Safety signs which was originally planned for November has been rescheduled for the last week in January. ERYC Traffic Management Team also provided an update on the work to finalise the technical specifications for the design of the Road Crossing, notifying the Parish Council of a further traffic survey which was already underway.

Antisocial Behaviour on the Village Green

The first grant application for funding to follow up on the recommendations made by the ERYC Antisocial Behaviour Officer, submitted before Christmas was unsuccessful, however a further grant application has now been submitted and initial indications are positive – so fingers crossed for a successful outcome this time!

Village Hall Grant Success

In December the Parish Council and Village Hall Committee members were pleased to take receipt of the first instalment of grant funding to assist in making essential repairs to the heating system. The Village Hall will be hosting a series of new events including free films shows, see front cover for details

Parish Precept 2023/24

In December the Parish Council set the precept for the coming year at £46,144.00 reflecting an increase of 3% on the previous year. Agreeing the increase Council members considered very carefully the balance between ensuring sufficient funds to continue to provide essential services at 'Parish Level' and the impact of the cost-of-living increases on residents, deciding to keep the increase as low as possible while covering costs.

Defibrillators

After some routine maintenance and replacements both Defibrillators are now in full working order and registered with Yorkshire Ambulance Service.

Cemetery

Having trialled a range of different measures to try to address Rabbit damage to planting and floral tributes in the Cemetery the Council is now investigating the cost of installing rabbit-proof fencing around the perimeter of the cemetery. Estimates are being sought for a discrete barrier fence at low level behind or within the boundary hedges. Any local contractors who may be interested to submit an estimate for this work should contact the Parish Clerk.

Allotments

The new 'gardening year' will begin in March. Current allotment holders will soon receive an invitation to pay for the year ahead with opportunities to pay in person or by post.

A small number of plots are currently vacant and available for rent – if you are interested in taking a plot, or a portion of one, please contact the Clerk or speak

to one of the Councillors on site.

Boyes Lane Recreation Ground Charity

Plans for the establishment of a 'Community Orchard' are now underway and planting will proceed in early spring, weather permitting. The next meeting of the Trustees of Boyes Lane Recreation Ground Charity is on 7th February 2023, 7.00pm in The Village Hall.

W: WINDOWS: Keep your windows locked
