# PARISH COUNCIL.

Summary of Parish Council Minutes January/February 2014.

## Public participation.

Following a request for an update on the Travellers at Mill Lane the Clerk read out a letter from ERYC that no further action could be taken until the travellers returned to the site. A villager has written to ERYC voicing his concern about the inconsiderate parking of vehicles along School Lane, the blocking of driveways and parking close to junctions. After a previous report of this nature villagers were advised, by the local Police Sergeant, to take registration numbers, report them to the Clerk who would write a letter which would be endorsed by the Police and action taken. Civil enforcement officers are aware of the situation and will monitor the location as duties permit. A member of the public, requesting news about a replacement postbox was told there was no further information at present. Representatives of the Vikings asked if consideration had been given by the Council to their request for a lease on part of Saltaugh Road playing field. They were invited to stay at the meeting during the discussion on this topic which was an item on the agenda.

## Playing Fields.

The bench referred to in previous minutes is to be purchased at a cost of £450.00, with the finance for a second one, bought out of the Playing Field budget, to be sanctioned at the next meeting. There is no further news from the Rugby Club concerning the lease of the playing field. Following the playing fields safety inspection there are one or two minor jobs which need to be done. These will be carried out as soon as weather permits. A notice displaying details of an emergency contact is to be placed on Eastfield Road playing field.

## Allotmemts.

All rents have been collected and banked. Attention will be given to the paths as soon as the weather allows.. All allotments have been tidied. There are several allotments vacant at present.

#### Cemetery.

Cats are still causing a problem. A resident reported the theft of wired silk flowers from his late wife's grave. A search of the cemetery was made but none found. There is no further information about the War Graves. Funding can be obtained from the Commonwealth War Graves Commission

#### War Memorial.

The carol singing round the Memorial was very enjoyable. Thanks were given to all those who attended or helped in any way.

#### Churchyard.

A letter requesting removal of the lime tree in the Churchyard has been received from St Nicholas PCC. ERYC will be contacted for advice.

## Streets and Verges.

No action has been taken over the hole on the grass in Northfield. ERYC has been contacted again. Verges in Westerdale Close are being churned up by having vehicles parked on them. Residents are to be contacted by the Clerk. The Clerk is to write to ERYC asking if small notices can be put on the verge along Hull Road asking drivers not to park on the grass verge where the bulbs are planted. The Environmental Officer is to be contacted over the amount of goods for sale at a property on Ottringham Road.

#### Boyes Lane.

Enquiries have been made as to the provision of fruit trees. A strong hedge cutter is required to cut back the hedges in Boyes Lane field. They are inaccessible due to there being too many trees. Fruit trees have now been planted but need protection round them. Some donations have been received from villagers for work on the field.

## Village Plan.

Road Watch in the village is now active.

40 extra copies of FORWARD will be required to cover the new developments. It was agreed these should be purchased.

## Flag Flying Protocol.

Discussion took place as to the protocol that should be adopted for the flying of the Union Jack all year. A recorded vote was taken and the proposal was defeated by 6 votes to 3.

## Councillors' Forum.

A question was asked as to the location of Youth Club funds. This matter is to be followed up.

#### 1ST KEYINGHAM SCOUTS.

# POLICE.

Hi Everyone,

Dates for the police surgeries at 3C's Cafe Keyingham: 7th April, 14th May, 9th of June all 11 a.m. to 12 noon. Please come along and speak to your local PCSO! On 7th April the cafe will be closed but a PCSO will be outside in a police vehicle.

Here is some useful information should you become a victim of fraud.

What is Fraud? Fraud happens when somebody lies, or deceives you in order to cause harm, usually by costing you money. Even if you have not lost money, you may still have experienced fraud.

Report fraud and Internet crime to ACTION FRAUD. Examples of internet crime: criminals attack your computer with a virus or spyware and try and steal personal information such as user names and passwords. Online auction scams where the Seller asks you to pay by money transfer or direct to their bank account. Phishing e-mails with links to fake websites to trick people into entering personal details or account information.

ACTION FRAUD is the U.K.'s national reporting centre for fraud and Internet crime. Members of the public, the police, businesses and charities can report to ACTION FRAUD online or on the phone. If you are reporting via the website there is online chat support provided. As ACTION FRAUD takes crime reports on behalf of the police, reporting directly is likely to be quicker and more convenient for you than visiting your local police station. You will receive a crime reference number when you report it to ACTION FRAUD and it will be transferred securely to the National Fraud Intelligence bureau for analysis and assessment. By reporting incidents of fraud or internet crime to ACTION FRAUD you are enabling the police and fraud authorities to build a profile of those committing fraud and catch those involved.

To contact ACTION FRAUD visit www.actionfraud.police.uk 24 hours a day, 7 days a week or you can contact them on 0300 123 2040. Phone lines are open Monday to Friday 8.00a.m. to 9.00p.m. and Saturday Sunday 9.00a.m. to 5.00 p.m. Closed Bank Holidays.

Anyone can become a victim of fraud. The best thing you can do is speak out about it by reporting it to ACTION FRAUD and help protect other people from becoming victims themselves.


FIRST: Indoor bowling.
