Since the last 'Roundup' we have successfully held the first face to face Parish Council meeting in the main hall on 19th May. It was wonderful to be able to meet together, albeit in a 'covid secure' socially distanced way and begin to plan events and activities as the easing of lockdown progresses, looking forward once more to social activities in and around the village.

The Annual Parish Meeting was held as scheduled, incorporating opportunities for 'pre-booked' participation by members of the public.

Members received the auditors Annual Report and voted to retain their services for the following financial year.

Cllr. Lee presented the Annual Report of the Boyes Lane Sub-committee and responded to questions.

A date was set for a public meeting to be held on the Boyes Lane Amenity Area at 2.00pm 24th June open to all Keyingham residents who wish to contribute to the future development of the area.

Whilst ideas and suggestion are always welcome members of the sub-committee stressed the need for active participation in the practical care and management of the area into the future.

So... if you have some time, skills and energy to contribute the PC would be especially pleased to see you at the meeting on the 24th.

It was with regret that members received the resignations of two long standing and respected members of the 'team' firstly, Cllr. Len Haxby who has contributed to many aspects of village life over the years has decided that his focus must presently be the care and support of his dear wife Rosalie.

Secondly our brilliant street cleaner, David Kinnear, has decided to 'hang up his brush' and although we will seek replacements for each of these wonderful folks,

they will, each in their unique way, be hard acts to follow!

The Chair and members would like to express their sincere gratitude to each of them and send them our best wishes for the future.

We will be addressing the vacancies over the next few weeks so if you are interested in becoming a councillor in Keyingham or the in the paid position of Street Cleaner - please contact the Clerk in the first instance.

Following the annual independent inspection of all our play equipment has just taken place and council will be following up on the recommendations over the next few weeks. One of the more popular pieces of equipment - The zip-wire on Saltaugh Road, has required running repairs over the last month, largely due to vandalism, but also because of 'wear and tear'. A more substantial repair/replacement is likely to be needed, so in the meantime please take extra care and supervision when using the equipment.

In the last '*Forward*' we were preparing to put up a low fence around the burial ground to prevent rabbit damage to the planting there. We are now pleased to report that we have been able to discourage rabbits from munching on our flowers making the fence unnecessary for the time being!

The trees lining the road at the bottom of Eastfield Road and close to the cemetery will be pruned to prevent them overhanging the road and work on this will commence shortly. When the contractor is working on the area the facility will be closed for a short time.

The plans for the development at Mount Airey were discussed at the meeting of the PC in March. The PC lodged an ob-

jection to the development and requested the following via the ERYC Planning Portal. Since then, we have been notified that the plans will be considered by the ERYC Planning Committee at a future date which has not yet been notified.

The cabinet housing the defibrillator situated at the Village Hall has been replaced with a new one and is inworking order.

As part of the agenda of the regular meeting of the PC the members received and signed off the Annual Statement of Accounts which will now be passed to the External Auditor. The standard period of public scrutiny will begin on 14th of June for 30 working days. The Annual Governance and Accountability Review will be published on the website.

The next scheduled meeting of the PC is 7.00pm on Wednesday 16th June in Keyingham Village Hall (Main Hall)

Public participation is always welcome - attendance must be pre booked and can be arranged by contacting the Clerk up to 24 hours before the meeting.

The Chairman and Members of Keyingham Parish Council we ask that everyone continues to 'do their bit' to support the 'steps to recovery', please have your vaccine when offered and follow social distancing guidelines.

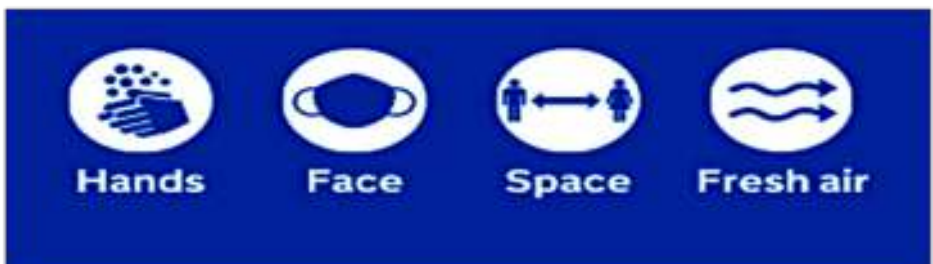

Although I receive a lot of information via the Neighbourhood Alert system. <https://www.humberside.police.uk/my-community-alert> Much of it is not related to Keyingham or if it is, it is out of date by the time the magazine is produced, however I have received two pieces which I believe are worth including in this edition. The first is regarding fraud.

If you become a victim of fraud, the impact can be considerable and have a huge impact on your confidence and wellbeing as well as your financial situation. Say No To Fraud, developed by the PCC's Community Engagement Team, features the real stories of local victims of fraud and aims to reduce the number of victims by committing to increase knowledge of the types of fraud, the methods used by the criminals and advice on how to protect yourself and those you love from becoming a victim of these crimes.

We are also asking you to take 5 minutes to talk about fraud with people you care about. Some victims of fraud are embarrassed and might find it embarrassing to tell anyone, because they feel they have been duped, victims often blame themselves. **It is never your fault.**

We need to stop feeling embarrassed about becoming victims and take back our right to say no to fraud! Close the door, press delete or hang up on these criminals.

PROTECT YOUR POOCH

Dog theft is on the rise and we are urging the public to keep their dogs **SECURE, IN SIGHT and SEARCHABLE**, and to help make pet theft a **SPECIFIC OFFENCE**.

Keep them:

- 1. SECURE** (pets are easily stolen from unsecured gardens if left unattended)
- 2. IN SIGHT** (when out and about keep them close and practice good recall)
- 3. SEARCHABLE** (to support quicker recovery if they go missing keep them microchipped, tagged and up to date photos)
