Queens Platinum Jubilee Celebrations

The following information is from the [Royal Website](#) To celebrate this unprecedented anniversary, events and initiatives will take place throughout the year, culminating in a four day UK bank holiday weekend from Thursday 2nd to Sunday 5th June. The bank holiday will provide an opportunity for communities and people throughout the United Kingdom to come together to celebrate the historic milestone. The four days of celebrations will include public events and community activities, as well as national moments of reflection on The Queen's 70 years of service. On **Sunday 5 June** people across the country will be invited to sit down together to take part in the Big Jubilee Lunch, with street parties held across the UK.



As part of these celebrations and to support the [Queen's Green Canopy](#) event the Parish council will take delivery in March of trees and shrubs. These will be planted around the village. It is hoped that this planting will be undertaken by the children of the village, but all are invited to help. Look at the website or the next copy of the Forward for more information.

A meeting will be held in the village hall on the 12th February so that a working party can be set up to organise Keyingham's support for this momentous event. If you have ideas or just wish to help organise the celebrations please attend this meeting.

Parish Council Round Up December 2021 – January 2022

Boyes Lane Recreation Ground

At the meeting of trustees on Wednesday 19th January discussions included, satisfaction regarding recent conclusion of the works to remove soil, stones wood, glass and other debris left over from levelling the mounds of soil. Members who had assisted with this work were thanked for their efforts, as were those Trustees and Councillors who had helped to replace the broken gatepost at the entrance to the recreation ground. The ground now ready to be prepared for re-planting, will be sown with varieties of wildflowers. It was agreed to purchase seeds and engage with volunteers, youth groups and Keyingham Primary School to assist with the planting. Models for engagement with volunteers and working groups were also discussed and a meeting between Trustees and volunteers was set for 2nd February see bottom of page 3. Ideas for future projects included the creation of a pond or bog garden, nesting boxes and work to thicken and improve the hedging.

‘Spare Our Children’ Signs

The issue of the ‘Spare our Children’ signs has progressed to include the opportunity for further time to seek views from residents on how to retain the signs in a legally permissible format. A separate article on this, with an example of how the sign might look is on page six of the magazine. On 28th January Representatives of the Parish Council met with members of Keyingham Primary School and the School Council to discuss their ideas for creating a design for the new signs. The School Council were really keen to be involved in the design process

and will be working in partnership with the PC on this great project.

Keyingham Primary School Student Council

The Keyingham Primary School Student Council are really getting up to speed with their OPAL project - which is to make play and learning more engaging for all pupils. Recently as a result of their hard work on seeking employer sponsorship for their project they received sand and play equipment from Garry Ralph of Ralph Builders LTD. MR Builders have also pledged timber and materials for the construction of a sand pit and the Parish Council will be rolling up their sleeves to help with its construction!

Queens Platinum Jubilee Celebrations

At the January meeting it was agreed to invite residents to create a working group to plan activities to celebrate the Queens Platinum Jubilee. A meeting will be held in Keyingham Village Hall on **12th February 10.00am**. All welcome. The Parish Council have applied to ERYC for a share of the Jubilee funds which will help toward the delivery of activities to commemorate this wonderful achievement. A parcel of Trees and shrubs is on its way to us from the ‘Queens Green Canopy’ and will be arriving in March to be planted with the help of Keyingham Primary School, youth groups and adult volunteers as a lasting ‘green legacy.’ The possibility of a ‘Village Beacon’ was also

discussed and it was agreed that costs and the practicalities of siting a beacon would require some careful consideration, but that it may be something which a working group may wish to explore further.

Re-seeding and Repairs

At the January meeting it was agreed to level and re-seed parts of the Dog Exercise area on Eastfield Road. This work will take place in the Spring and it may be necessary to close the area temporarily and/or cordon off the re-seeded sections for a while to allow the grass to grow. Further updates & precise dates will be posted on the website. The area beneath the football goal on Saltaugh Road Amenity Area will also be raised with sand & soil and reseeded. Running repairs to play and exercise equipment, bins, shelters are being made. The area behind the rugby changing rooms is currently being assessed and discussions will take place with Holderness Vikings about the remedial work which needs to be carried out.

War Memorial

In January Councillors began considering whether, due to increased traffic through the centre of the Village, the impending sale of the Chapel and land in front of it, and the success of the Remembrance

Sunday Service in November, it may be appropriate to investigate the feasibility, cost and logistics involved in moving the war memorial to a safer location. Councillors agreed they should begin seeking resident's views and gain a better understanding of the costs and processes involved. The Clerk was tasked with contacting the War Memorials Trust as a starting point for further discussions, while beginning to gather views from villagers.

The next scheduled meeting of the PC is 7.00pm on Tuesday 15th February 2022 in Keyingham Village Hall (Main Hall) **Public participation is always welcome. Although there has been relaxation of some restrictions we would be grateful if you would please continue to follow social distancing guidelines.**

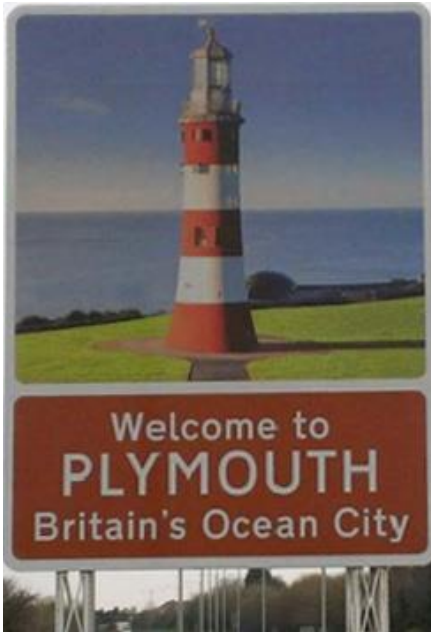
As many of you will know, the parade down to the War memorial did not take place last year. This was due to the increase in traffic on the A1033 making it impossible to obtain permission to close the road for the parade. The laying of the wreaths took place in the grounds of St Nicholas Church on Remembrance Sunday 2021.

You may also know that the Methodist hall is now to be sold.

These events caused the Parish Council to think about the possibility of moving the War memorial to another place in the village, which would allow the parade to take place without the need for road closures.

The project is not straight forward and many groups will have to be consulted if this is to go ahead. The Parish Council wish to inform the parish that they are thinking about this and will through the website and future copies of the forward magazine seek the views of the village on this project.

‘Save Our Children’ Road Signs

You may have noticed that the ‘Save our Children’ Road sign at the east end of the village has been temporarily removed to allow access to the Strawberry Fields development. We have also been informed by the East Riding of Yorkshire Council that the sign at the west end of the village will also have to be remodelled as it does not meet the road sign requirements of the highways department.

The Parish council have been informed that signs such as the example shown on the left are suitable in regards to the print font layout and size. The Parish council has approached Keyingham School to help design suitable graphics and wording to go on the new signs. It is hoped that the best designs will be on display for comments by the parishioners prior to production and installation at either end of the village.
