## **Changes to governments Covid Rules**

### **From 12 April.**

- Indoor leisure (including gyms) open for use individually or within household groups.
  - Rule of 6 or two households outdoors. No household mixing indoors.
  - Outdoor attractions such as zoos, theme parks and drive-in cinemas.
  - Libraries and community centres.
  - Personal care premises.
  - All retail. Outdoor hospitality.
  - All children's activities, indoor parent & child groups (up to 15 parents).
  - Domestic overnight stays (household only).
  - Self-contained accommodation (household only).
  - Funerals (30), wakes, weddings and receptions (15)
- Minimise travel. No international holidays. Event pilots begin.No

### **No earlier than 17 May.**

- Indoor entertainment and attractions.
- 30 person limit outdoors. Rule of 6 or two households (subject to review).
- Domestic overnight stays.
- Organised indoor adult sport.
- Most significant life events (30).
- Remaining outdoor entertainment (including performances).
- Remaining accommodation.
- Some large events (expect for pilots) - capacity limits apply.
- Indoor events: 1,000 or 50%.
- Outdoor other events: 4,000 or 50%.
- Outdoor seated events: 10,000 or 25%.

# Parish Council 'Round-up'

The last time I sat down to compose the PC roundup we were just entering the second Lockdown, so this time I am pleased to be able to say that the first stages of 'easing' appear to have gone well and we are progressing towards being able to meet once again with our families and friends and if all goes to plan, as a Council. It seems likely that 'traditional' (socially distanced) Council meetings will not resume until June, but we will keep you posted on any updates via the website.

Since the last issue of the *Forward* the Council have received the sad news the loss of Dave Camplin and Debs Medforth, to Covid related illnesses. Our deepest condolences go out to their families at this very sad time. During March we were also notified of the death of Reg Moss, whom many of you will have known. A keen plantsman in his later years, producing succulents for sale to support fundraising in Keyingham. I would like to reiterate the offer of support to all those families who have lost a loved one or are coping with other long-term illness we extend our deepest sympathy and invite you to contact us if we can be of any assistance. The 'Helpers Network' is still active and can be accessed via the PC.

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During the Lockdown many of you have made good use of the outdoor spaces on Saltaugh Road, Eastfield Road and Boyes Lane. It has been brought to our attention that some of the signage needs updating and we will be working on this over the next few weeks. A resident who regularly uses the outdoor gym equipment on Saltaugh Road has asked us to consider making safety signage more visible. The PC are currently considering the best way to achieve this. In the meantime, please could everyone using the equipment make sure that they are fully familiar with safety notices and precautions for use.

The annual independent inspection of all our play equipment has just taken place and over the next month Councillors will be making some minor repairs. Areas identified for specialist repair will be undertaken by contractors and may involve closing items of equipment to use during that time. A full copy of the inspection report will be posted on the website following the next meeting.

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During the last two months we have sadly had report two incidents to the Police relating to criminal damage at the Boyes Lane Amenity Area. Broken furniture, damage to the cabins, and stolen furniture are, sadly, common occurrences, and though incredibly disheartening for the people who devote their time to developing this area, can usually be remedied.

However a matter of a completely different nature recently required the closure of the field to all users, specialist help from ERYC before the area could be re-opened. The incident which resulted in a resident's dog ingesting poison, which appeared to have been placed in a rabbit hole, was treated as criminal damage and reported to the police.

Thankfully, due to the quick action of the owner, the dog made a full recovery. Following the specialist advice form ERYC repeated trough checks of the area. The field was re-opened. The PC were incredibly shocked by this incident and request that anyone observing anything suspicious on any of the public spaces contact the police immediately.

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Thank you to all the allotment holders who sent in their rents we have now collected all the rents for the year and issued tenancy agreements to new tenants. All the plots are currently taken, however if you are interested in taking a plot in the future please contact the Clerk for details and to have your name placed on a waiting list.

It will soon be time to refresh the planting in the cemetery with summer bedding and as we have recently had problems with rabbits eating our plants as quickly as we planted them we will be fitting a chicken-wire barrier around the perimeter to discourage them from entering. This will need to be done as discretely and safely as possible, and according to advice we have received, may not need to be a permanent fixture, just in place long enough to encourage the bunnies to 'snack' elsewhere.

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The trees lining the road at the bottom of Eastfield road and close to the cemetery will require pruning to prevent them overhanging the road and work on this will commence shortly.

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Planning issues arising in the early spring have included a continued focus on the arrangements for run-off of rainwater from the Horrox Court development and the PC is awaiting a report from the buildings Inspectorate to establish whether (a) the drains have been installed according to the plans and (b) whether the drains are fit for purpose even if they are installed according to the approved plan.

The plans for the development at Mount Airey were discussed at the meeting of the PC in March. The PC lodged an objection to the development and requested the following via the ERYC Planning Portal.

- \* A traffic management plan, before, during and after construction.
- \* Clear and sufficient arrangements for the management of all forms of water outflow, sewerage, grey water and rainwater/ surface water.
- \* Clarification of arrangements for on-site parking for each dwelling
- \* Clarification of the appropriate ratio of affordable housing.
- \* A reduction in the number of proposed dwellings from 12 to 9.

The PC would like to remind residents that if they have any views with regard to any planning proposals it is wise to register them themselves via the planning portal.

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Instances of Dog fouling appear to have reduced; however this is a constant issue so I will repeat our plea to *always* pick-up after your pet and keep the pavements and public areas safe and healthy.

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We would also ask that parents and carers encourage young people to pickup litter, especially plastic, and dispose of it appropriately and to respect the local environment by not entering fields or enclosures where animals are kept.

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The cabinet housing the defibrillator situated at the Village Hall is due for renewal and will be replaced with a new one over the next few weeks to ensure that the equipment is kept in good working order.

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Council meetings will continue be held via 'Zoom' until further notice.

Meetings will return to face to face/in person forum as soon as it is safe and appropriate to do so.

Public participation via 'Zoom' is welcome and can be arranged by contacting the Clerk by 5.00pm on the day of the meeting.
