Crossing on the A1033

The work to improve the road crossing was nearing completion in August and now the days are getting shorter and darkness falls earlier it is easy to spot the bright studs in the centre of the road on the approach to the crossing. The red roadside markers and new beacons really show up the crossing area and with the addition of the CCTV camera in that area the Parish Council are hopeful that road use in the general area of the crossing will be safer and more respectful. In October the parish Council will be investigating the possibility of adding SIDs (Speed Indicator Devices) along routes though Keyingham, in particular the approach routes to the Primary School.

Keyingham Village Hall

Thanks to committee members and volunteers the Village Hall improvements are continuing. The new floor in the 'old kitchen' due to be completed during August. Plans for Christmas celebrations are well underway and will include a Children's Christmas Party

At 11.00 am there will be a dedication and 2 minutes silence after which wreathes will be laid in the Church Grounds.

The Church will remain open following the Service and Dedication with light refreshments served.

Wreathes laid in the churchyard will be collected and taken to the War Memorial by the Parish Council.

Any individuals wishing to visit the war memorial, either on Sunday 10th or on the 11th may do so, however we are actively discouraging public gatherings at the War Memorial itself as the roads will not be closed to traffic.
