D-Day 80 commemorations.

D-Day - 6 June 1944 - was the largest amphibious invasion in the history of warfare. The statistics of D-Day, codenamed Operation Overlord, are staggering. The Allies used over 5,000 ships and landing craft to land more than 150,000 troops on five beaches in Normandy. The landings marked the start of a long and costly campaign in north-west Europe, which ultimately convinced the German high command that defeat was inevitable.

Planning & Development

The spring of 2024 saw a significant focus on planning and development in Keyingham. Building operations were suspended by ERYC at the site of Mt Airey farm. In February a new application was made to develop land to the west of Church Lane (or 'Cow Field' as it is sometimes referred to locally) with a proposal for 16 'first home' dwellings. In March a strategic development proposal was put forward for 147 dwellings on the site of Village Nurseries and an amendment to a condition relating to the Strawberry Fields development also raised concerns from neighbours. The updated position on these developments is that the proposed development on Church Lane was **refused** by ERYC Planning Committee at the beginning of May. The proposal for 147 dwellings on the site of Village Nurseries was received at the March meeting, with a relatively short deadline of April 10th for comments and/or queries. Unlike the proposed development on Church Lane, the land associated with this proposal is identified in the local area strategic plan as a 'brownfield site' suitable for development and as such the site itself had already been subject to environmental impact assessments. Due to the scale of this proposal the

Parish Council held a dedicated meeting to provide a considered and timely response to the proposal. The statement, raising concerns regarding parking, accessways and drainage can be found at

Road Safety in Keyingham

At the May meeting of the Parish Council Cllr Sean McMaster was able to confirm that works to improve the road crossing would take place of three days at the beginning of June, June 3rd – 7th. Councillors were delighted that the long-awaited improvements were about to begin, however it was clear that in order to do the work it would be necessary to close roads, use traffic controls and this would inevitably affect the flow of traffic through the centre of the village.

The work will begin very soon so please allow extra time for journeys, check that your usual route in and out of the village is accessible and follow diversions as necessary. Up to date info will be posted on the PC website and ERYC website.

CCTV

The most recent update on the start-date for installation of the CCTV cameras indicates that work will begin on 3rd and 4th of June alongside the improvements to the road crossing. Councillors were

pleased to note that the monitoring of the Village Green and Saltaugh road would begin almost immediately on installation, this is welcomed, due to a slight increase in antisocial behaviour in these areas recently. Monitoring of the road crossing would commence in line with completion of road works as the two projects utilise some of the same infrastructure for lighting etc.

Keyingham Village Hall

The Village Hall continues to complete a steady stream of improvements and repairs, thanks to the Village Hall Committee, Parish Councillors and an army of volunteers. Prices for a broadband connection have been considered and a supplier selected. Paint has been donated by Crown Paints, and is available for a full re-decoration of the hall. Extra volunteers are being sought to help with the painting, if you are able to help, please contact a member of the Village Hall Committee.

The Easter Egg Hunt, (in partnership with Boyes Lane Recreation Ground Charity) was a great success and sparked ideas for other events throughout the year.

Boyes Lane Recreation Ground AGM

The Annual General Meeting of the Trustees of Boyes Lane Recreation Group Charity took place on 7th May in Keyingham Village Hall at 7.00pm.

Ricky Hoggard was elected chairman

of Trustees and Neil Whitlam was elected vice-chairman of Trustees. In his report the Chairman gave a positive summary of the work achieved throughout the year and recorded a vote of thanks for the work carried out to enhance the environment, add to the planting and encourage more people to access the area. Keyingham Parish Council AGM

The Parish Council held its AGM on 21st May.

All members agreed to continue as Councillors. Cllr David Clark was elected as Chairman and Cllr Melvyn Smith was elected Vice Chairman.

The one remaining vacancy was filled by co-option. Councillors agreed to Co-opt Mrs Victoria White, Headteacher Keyingham Primary School to Keyingham Parish Council.

The Annual Accounting Statements were approved and the Annual Governance Accountability and Return was signed off for 2023-24.

Cllr David Clark offered a vote of thanks to all members for their work and commitment throughout the year. Cllr Clark also recognised the contributions of residents who gave freely of their time and energies to support their community.

D-Day Anniversary Commemorations

Utilising grant funds from ERYC received by Keyingham Parish Council, Keyingham Village Hall and St. Nicholas Church will each be providing opportunities to commemorate the D-D Anniversary on 6th June. (see front page for details) A wreath will be laid on the war memorial by Cllr Ray Lawton. A commemorative flag will be flown for an extended

period throughout June to reflect the period of the commemorations.

Roadworks on Eastfield Road

The extensive works being carried out to renew footpaths and curbs on Eastfield Road are on-going and although they will be a huge improvement when completed the works themselves have caused disruption including loss of access to grass cutting on the amenity field and dog exercise area.

The long grass is causing some issues including an increase in instances of dog fouling. New signage and shorter grass will help, but please take extra care in this area when walking or exercising your dog.

News from Holderness Health

As a result of a request by your editor I have received the following information about the upgrade to the practice computer system from CEO of Holderness Health. Amalia Booker said:

- Our new IT system went live as planned on Monday 13 May
- Online services have now been enabled on the new system
- It transpires that some patients will have no problems continuing to use the NHS App (without having to do anything further) whilst others may encounter an issue. It seems that this is related to how patients signed up in the first place and unfortunately is out of our control.
- For patients who cannot successfully login to the NHS App, when they try to login they will likely receive a message to contact the practice.
- To ensure that we can help patients as efficiently as possible, we have organised 2 drop-in sessions next week so that patients can call in and obtain the information they will need to reconnect to the NHS App. If possible, we are asking patients to access one of these sessions rather than attending the practice at another time or calling the surgery. This would really help us to avoid long queues as we will have a dedicated person at the drop-in sessions who will be there just to help patients with their online access. We understand, of course, that not everyone will be able to attend one of the drop-in sessions but for those who can, it would be much appreciated.
- All of the same services are available as previously including repeat prescription ordering, appointment booking, access to medical record etc.
- For anyone who previously used Patient Access rather than the NHS App, this is unfortunately no longer available. The 2 alternative options are to use the NHS App or the app associated with our new IT system, which is known as Airmid. Our staff have all received training on the new system but using it 'live' with a patient is quite different and things are taking just a little bit longer as we get used to navigating around it. Thank you to the many patients who have been kind and patient with our staff as we gain experience with the new system.
