Student Council End-of-Year Assembly 2025–2026



Good afternoon everyone. We are Keyingham Primary School Student Council, and as we come to the end of our time as Student Councillors, we would like to share some of the things we have been involved in this year.

Being a Student Councillor means representing the children in our classes, listening to their ideas and making sure their voices are heard. Throughout everything we have done this year, we have tried to demonstrate our school values and expectations.

We have shown **Kindness** by thinking about others and looking for ways to make a positive difference to our school and local community.

We have shown **Curiosity** by asking questions, researching our local history and wanting to learn more about the places and people around us.

We have shown **Courage** by sharing our ideas, speaking to adults and community leaders, presenting our work and sometimes stepping outside our comfort zones.

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We have demonstrated positive **Behaviour** by representing Keyingham Primary School wherever we have visited and showing others what it means to be a responsible member of our school community.

Earlier this school year, we visited St. Nicolas Church in Keyingham for Remembrance Day.

One of our biggest successes was seeing our **Road Naming Project** continue to make an impact in our local community. We featured in the Holderness Gazette and the Hull Daily Mail.

For the people who didn't know but last year, we choose six new street names for the new housing development in Keyingham.

This year, we also helped to plant trees on the local playing field.

Projects like this allow us to make a positive difference to the place where we live and leave something behind for future generations to enjoy.

Another exciting project began when **Iain Ogilvie**, the Project Lead for the Ottringham Church Project, came into school to speak to us.

He told us about the work needed at the church and explained how he would like Student Council to become involved in the project.

We then had a fantastic day visiting **Ottringham Church**.

We met with the project team and learned more about the history of the church, the building itself and the plans for its future.

We had a tour of the church and had the opportunity to ask questions and look closely at some of its amazing historical features.

After visiting the church, we went to the village institute for lunch and took part in a creative LEGO activity.

We used LEGO to explore ideas and redesign the church roof. It was a brilliant way to think creatively about the project and the future of this important local building.

A Message to Our School

For us, this is our final week as Student Councillors, but the work of Student Council does not end here.

Over the summer, we would like you all to think about whether you could represent your class next year.

Could you listen to other people's ideas?

Could you speak up for your class?

Parish Council Round Up July 2026

ERYC Ward Councillors Update

In the regular 'Ward Update' slot, Cllr Sean McMaster provided an update on actions in response to recent flooding on Saltaugh Road, Russell Drive and Jellison Walk. A summary of the findings included infiltration of the drains by tree roots and silt build-up.

Flooding on Willowfield Drive and Compton Drive were being addressed individually and separately with Yorkshire Water, as the gardens of properties were flooded with foul water. Actions included the removal of silt and fitting of non-return valves to prevent reflux. It was recognised that these measures would provide temporary solutions and that a longer-term plan would be required. It was proposed that overall updating of the drainage system and pumping station should form part of the overall strategy to address capacity issues. Graham Stuart's office is acting as facilitator of a joint approach on behalf of ERYC and YW.

As part of a general flood risk assessment investigations were carried out on the main culvert running down the centre of the village (which carries surface water) by ERYC as a 'without prejudice' activity. ERYC were still awaiting update from Yorkshire Water on foul water backing up in certain areas of the village. A meeting with the Flood Risk Management Team has prompted a series of actions, some of which are on-going. At the July meeting of the Parish Council members thanked The Parish Council Cllr. McMaster for keeping pressure on this important issue and for the results achieved to date.

AGM

In May at the Annual General Meeting members were sorry to receive resignations from two councillors who had fulfilled active roles within the Parish Council, and the wider community. Cllr Ray Lawton, having served as a Parish Councillor for an astounding period of 34 years and Cllr Ricky Hoggard who served as a Parish Councillor for several years.

Both gentlemen fulfilled several roles as committee members, trustees and as councillors and each served their communities with great commitment.

The Parish Council extends sincere thanks to both of them and wishes them well in all future activities.

Co-option of new Councillors

Following the resignation of two council members and after completion of the statutory notice period, Keyingham Parish Council welcomed three new members in July. We are pleased to extend a warm welcome to Cllr Mike Copley, Cllr Tom Atkins and Cllr. Michelle Preston who bring skills and experience in education and in business to their roles as councillors.

Play Equipment: Replacement Zip-wire

In the late spring/early summer period several options have been considered for replacing the broken zip-wire on Saltaugh Road Amenity Area. Taking into account feedback from children, parents, and members of the Vikings Rugby Club, Councillors will be considering quotes for a longer, aerial runway, (25-30m) to be situated close to the MUGA. Provided all the information to support a decision is

received, councillors are hoping to take a decision on this option at the August meeting – so if you have views which you would like to share with us please come along to the August meeting or email the Clerk.

Keyingham Primary School Student Council

In July the Student Council once again presented to the school an overview of the successful project activities carried out this year. Student Councillors have become an established feature of the governance and development of the school through engagement with **School Values** and their support of community projects. Their influence and impact continue to grow and the Parish Council are incredibly proud of the partnership and its achievements. Cllr Clark and all the members extend their very best wishes to the year 6 leavers, Flo and Jacob, who go on to Senior School in September, they have been excellent role models demonstrating strong leadership while on the Student Council and have great futures ahead of them!

The Student Council presentation to the school and end of year photograph with their special guests are featured on the front page.

Allotments

After welcoming a several ‘new gardeners’ we are pleased to report that all the allotments plots are now taken.

Green Spaces Policy

During the spring councillors began considering the benefit of a policy statement or guidelines setting out how the various ‘Green Spaces’ owned by the Parish Council should be managed, in the interest of promoting biodiversity, wildlife and to create opportunities for active, intentional stewardship of parks and amenity areas. At the July meeting Councillors agreed to adopt a policy which will be reviewed over the first 12 months of its operation and then annually or as required.
