Changes to the Village.



I hope that the disruption caused during the road works have not upset the villagers too much. The upgrades to the A1033 are designed to make the road crossing safer. The road has been resurfaced. The belisha beacons have been changed to make them higher and brighter. New cats eyes have been installed which are designed to glow in the dark. CCTV has been installed to identify poor parking on the road and identify speeding drivers.

CCTVs have been installed on the Garth and on Saltaugh Road. To record incidences of vandalism and anti-social behaviour.

It is important that anyone spotting and law breaking report the incidence to the police via 101.

The police will only accept information from villagers who actually witness the event. Unless events are reported then they can not be recorded or acted upon.

The data from the CCTV is not available to villagers including councillors, however it is available to the police.

Road Safety in Keyingham

The work to improve the road crossing in continuing and despite delays relating to the removal old beacon outside the Bell PH, the works are back on schedule and working towards completion by the beginning of August.

Please continue to allow extra time for journeys, check that your usual route in and out of the village is accessible and follow diversions as necessary. Updates will be posted on the PC website and ERYC website.

CCTV

Two of the three sites identified for CCTV monitoring are now operational with the installation of the cameras on Main Street being scheduled to coincide with the work on the road crossing. The Parish Council are hopeful that all works will be completed by mid-August.

Antisocial Behaviour

Recently there have been a few instances of antisocial behaviour and damage to play equipment and to trees in public spaces. Regardless of whether areas are monitored by CCTV please continue to be vigilant and if antisocial behaviour is observed please contact the Police 101 number immediately.

Please bear in mind that the police will not accept 'third party reports' from anyone other than the person who observed the incident. Reporting incidents is worthwhile as it will help to identify 'trouble spots' and increase patrols in those areas.

Keyingham Village Hall

The Village Hall improvements now include renovations to the stage area and 'old kitchen' and the broadband connection has been completed so the Village Hall now has WiFi which, amongst other things, can be used to help make heating this large space more efficient.

Extra volunteers are always wel-

come to assist with the on-going maintenance and repairs. Help is being sought to with the painting, if you are able to help please contact a member of the Village Hall Committee.

Keyingham Village Green-Christmas Lights

Following the site survey reported in the May edition of the Forward, the Parish Council accepted the quote supplied by ERYC for the installation of a power supply and safety enclosure to site a Christmas Tree with lights. Work on the installation will begin shortly.

Boyes Lane Recreation Ground

A family picnic will take place on the recreation ground on **4th August**, bring your own rug and picnic basket, enjoy the beautiful green space, talk to trustees about what is planned for the area and learn how you can get involved in developing this beautiful space. Cllr David Clark offered a vote of thanks to all members for their work and commitment throughout the year. Cllr Clark also recognised the contributions of residents

who gave freely of their time and energies to support their community.

D-Day Anniversary Commemorations

Utilising grant funds from ERYC received by Keyingham Parish Council, Keyingham Village Hall and St. Nicholas Church each created a special event to commemorate the 80th Anniversary of D-day. The 'Coffee Morning Team' delivered a brilliant D-Day themed event at the Village Hall with entertainment and some of their legendary cakes and baking. The event was incredibly successful – A BIG THANKYOU to the team for pulling out all the stops at short notice to make the event so enjoyable.

Churchwardens and members of St Nicholas Church held a special commemorative service, led by Rev. Philip West; with readings from the letters of service personnel kindly shared by Mrs Sheila Tindall; with family reminiscences of the conflict and displays of pictures and memorabilia lent by residents from their family archives.

Keyingham Scouts attended the service and did an excellent job of

‘Ringing the bells for Peace’ at the end of the service, for which they gained a D-Day badge.

A wreath was displayed during the service. This was later laid at the memorial on the main road by Councillor Lawton.

Thankyou to everyone who helped with or joined in these brilliant community events.

Roadworks on Eastfield Road

The works being carried out to renew footpaths and curbs on Eastfield Road are almost completed and Parish Councillors are currently in discussion with ERYC regarding the ‘finishing-off’ tasks including the re- seeding of the verges.

New Signage on Amenity Fields

Having replaced the notice board in the Cemetery and Placing a New Village notice board on Station Road on the side of the Village Hall, the PC are now focusing on updating the signage on Amenity Areas, updating the in-

formation and bringing them in line with current requirements. Some of the old signs has now been removed and will be replaced with new ones when they arrive.
