Parish Council Round Up March 2025

Keyingham Village Hall

Repairs and renovations are now nearing completion, and the hall is looking and clean and fresh in its spring colours and ready to host a series of planned events in the lead up to Easter. A very successful preloved clothing sale took place in March, an Easter coffee morning is planned for 9th April and an Easter Egg Hunt, in collaboration with the Boyes Lane Recreation Ground, will take place on 19th April.

Ward Councillors Update

In a regular slot of providing an update from the South-East Holderness Ward, Cllr Sean McMaster offered an update on matters affecting the Parish of Keyingham. The update includes feedback on issues affecting Keyingham directly and those which impact the wider Holderness Area. This useful link with the ERYC offers the opportunity to seek clarification on issues affecting Keyingham residents and to seek support for actions and improvements.

The update in March included confirmation that the work to widen the footpath along Saltaugh Road has been entered into the ERYC's schedule of works for the new financial year.

Deputy Police and Crime Commissioner, Cllr Leo Hammond, will be in attendance at the April meeting of the Parish Council to respond to questions on Road Safety. At this meeting Parish Councillors will be exploring

the opportunity to participate in the 'Auto Speed Watch' Trial along the A1033 as it passes through Keyingham.

Methodist Chapel

Possibilities for the future use of the former Chapel have been the topic of discussion at the February and March meetings. In February Council members discussed how it may support a group of residents who had expressed an interest in raising funds to secure the building for use as a community facility. In March, the council received proposals in 'public participation' from a local family who were interested to purchase the building and adjacent cottage, with plans to create 4 dwellings.

Further updates will be shared as they become available.

Holderness Vikings 'Brick in the Wall Project'

To help with the funding of the New Clubhouse and canteen building the Vikings are offering a brick in the wall sponsorship. 'Bricks' are priced at three levels and will bear the name of the sponsor, showing their support for young people enjoying rugby. Planning

In January we reported that land formerly occupied by Village Nurseries had been granted strategic planning approval. The development, which is now known as 'Mill View' has entered the demolition stage for removal of the existing buildings. Representatives of Gleeson Ltd, the developers, attended the Parish Council meeting in February. They responded to questions, shared site plans and offered opportunities for community engagement.

Councillors asked probing questions regarding proposals for drainage, including rainwater, 'grey' water and sewerage and received explanations of the plans in each case.

Parking spaces; road access and road safety were also discussed in detail. The provision of a light-controlled road crossing and its precise location on the A1033 is the subject of ongoing discussions. Councillors considered the point of the school crossing patrol to be an optimum location. keyinghamparishcouncil.eastriding.gov.uk/minutes.aspx Updates will be provided via the PC website as the development progresses and aspects of progress will be the subject of discussion at council meetings throughout the duration of the build.

A joint project between Gleesons, Keyingham Parish Council, Keyingham Primary School Student Council and ERYC street; is ongoing to provide the names for the roads on the new development. Each year group at the Primary School will be involved in choosing names for this important development and will be presenting their proposals at a Parish Council meeting in late spring/summer.

'Haxby Heritage Trail'

At the February meeting the Parish Councillors were delighted to hear that the last batch of blue plaques had been commissioned and delivery was imminent. Once the trail is fully completed and 'active' the 'Rosalie Haxby' plaque will show a QR code which, when scanned will activate a link to the trail information, allowing people to follow the trail and access information describing each location and its history. A huge thank you goes to Sarah Smith and all members of the group for completing this great project.

'Discovery walks' are planned with pupils from the School as soon as the trail links are active and the weather is a bit warmer!

Replacement of Missing Trees

At the February meeting, prompted by a resident request, Councillors discussed the opportunity to replace trees which had, over time been lost from the verge at the western side of Church Lane. It was agreed to consult with residents of Church Lane and ERYC with the view to replacement in the spring.

Dog Exercise Area

We have recently received feedback from residents that the Dog Exercise Area on Eastfield Road is regularly being used by commercial dog walk-

ing companies and that this is causing issues for residents and other users. At the March meeting councillors agreed new signage prohibiting commercial use. The sign will also reinforce accompanying dogs within the facility, requiring the users to keep their dogs under control at all times and 'picking up' after their dogs. On a positive note the Council were pleased to take up an offer to improve the bench seat inside the dog area. This is also a good opportunity to thank everyone who uses the facility respectfully and responsibly. The new signage should be in place by the end of April and will apply to Eastfield Road Dog Exercise Area and the Boyes Lane Recreation Ground.

VE VJ Day CommemorationIn March we received confirmation

that the PC had been successful in

bidding for funds to commemorate the 80th Anniversary of VE / VJ day. In a similar way to last year's commemorative events there will be a series of activities in the village on $8^{\rm th}$ May, offering everyone the opportunity to be involved. A Commemorative Flag will be raised in the Village Green at 09.00am. St Nicholas Church will be open and serving refreshments until 10.30am. An Indoor Street Party will take place in the Village Hall at 2.00- 4.00pm. Food will be available and you are encouraged to bring along food to share. Entertainment will be provided by Holderness Performing Arts. A service to give thanks for peace at St Nicholas Church 6.30pm. The Service will be attended by Keyingham Scouts who will 'Ring out the Bells for Peace' and once again refreshments will be available afterwards! Everyone is welcome to join in each of the events.
