Parish Council Round Up September 2025

Holderness Health responds to Councillor's Questions

In response to resident's feedback representatives of Holderness Health were invited to attend the September meeting of the Parish Council to provide in-person responses to questions about making appointments, especially with a GP, and about receiving prescription medication in an accessible and timely manner. In a thorough and detailed discussion representatives were able to clarify the levels of service which were sustainable alongside the plans providing access to health education and vaccination clinics in venues around Holderness. General support was recorded for vaccination sessions to take place in the Village Hall and it was agreed that members of the Health promotion team would visit the next Coffee Morning to seek resident's views. A full list of the questions and responses will be published on the PC website with the approved minutes of the August meeting, after the next meeting in October.

PCSO's Advice on tackling Antisocial Behaviour

At the same meeting PCSO's provided a summary of instances of reported antisocial behaviour over the last quarter and offered advice on tackling

antisocial behaviour. Officers were keen to stress that any antisocial or criminal behaviour should be reported to the police immediately and directly, by the person (s) observing it, giving a clear explanation of the behaviour and the time and place it occurred. Officers stressed that CCTV footage can only be accessed by the police when a location and timeframe are given in the report. In relation to 'Rough Sleepers' Officers advised that being present in a location did not constitute an offence, however examples of antisocial behaviour such as littering, verbal abuse, or attending to bodily functions in a public place should be reported to the Police the using the 101 non-emergency number.

ERYC Ward Councillors Update

In the regular 'Ward Update' slot, Cllr Sean McMaster confirmed that ERYC had repaired the damaged railings outside the School.

A site meeting to consider the options for future use of the site occupied by garages on Northfield was scheduled for the following week.

The new road crossing outside the Ship Inn was awaiting formal approval by Highways Planning. Cllr McMaster_confirmed that the ERYC Highways Management Team were_fully aware of the issues relating to parking on Saltaugh Road and had been advised that parking restrictions in this area would be likely to make the problem worse. Councillors agreed that a range of options should be investigated including the lease of additional land for car parking.

As Councillors are constantly looking for ways to share information with residents it was agreed that a Parish Council Facebook Page would be launched over the next few months. The FB page will be designed to carry 'immediate news' such as events, consultations, road closures, or disruptions to services as well as information which is also available on sections of the PC website. The Website, the Forward Magazine and the FB page will all be governed by a public Information Policy, which was adopted by the Council in August

Planning

Following an extensive discussion with the developer agricultural representative attending the July meeting of the Parish Council, it was resolved to support the Agricultural Anaerobic Digestion Facility on land North-East of East End Bungalow, Ottringham Road, Keyingham, Councillors registered concerns regarding the possible increase in volume of traffic to and from the facility.

Considering the application for five dwellings and vehicular access, to site of Village Nurseries Councillors requested clarification as to whether this application was subject to the same approval conditions as the Mill View development and was advised that it was, and that outline planning permission had been granted in 2020.

Erection of a single storey extension to the rear of 'Glyn Garth,' Hull Road Keyingham was Supported.

80th Anniversary of VJ Day

On 15th August, Keyingham Residents commemorated the 80th Anniversary of VJ by raising a special 80th Anniversary flag, flown together with a VE Day commemorative flag and the Union Jack, raised by Cllr Neil Whitelam at 9.30am. Councillors then attended the War memorial in Main Street where Cllr Ray Lawton laid a Poppy Wreath on behalf of the residents of Keyingham. Refreshments were served in St Nicholas Church and the Church bells rung to celebrate peace. Thankyou to everyone who joined together to remember those who served.

Remembrance Day Arrangements 2025

A Service of Remembrance will be held in St Nicholas Church at 10.00am on 9th November followed by two minutes silence and the laying of wreaths outside the East Window in the Church Grounds at 11.00. Refreshments will be available in Church after the Service and a warm welcome is extended to everyone. Wreaths will be transported to the War Memorial and a memorial flag will be raised on the Village Green.

Councillor Vacancy

There is still a vacancy on the Parish Council. All eligible individuals are welcomed, and public participation is seen as a valuable contribution to help shape direction and decision-making in the best interests of the village as a whole. The Parish Council would especially welcome interest from individuals involved with youth groups and activities in Keyingham. The Parish Council now has a membership of individuals with a wide range of backgrounds and skill sets including Education, Construction, Transport, Law, Leisure, Local Gov-

ernment and Business, many of whom continue to work within local companies who support the rural economy.
