## ERYC Ward Councillors Update

In the regular 'Ward Update' slot, Cllr Sean McMaster confirmed that

- Paths on Eastfield Road were scheduled for repair.
- Works to widen the footpath on Saltaugh Road would begin during the first week in January, weather permitting. (This is now well underway and should be completed in the next few weeks).
- Building work on Chapel Lane between 12<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> January would require a temporary road closure.
- In December ERYC Planning Enforcement Officers were due to attend The Travellers Site on Mill Road to advise on adherence to planning conditions relating to the number and type of mobile dwellings. Following the visit a planning application has been submitted and was discussed by councillors at the January meeting.
- Repairs to the Highway in numerous locations around Keyingham are scheduled to take place between the 4<sup>th</sup> – 19<sup>th</sup> March 2026.
- Contractors have been requested to install wheel-washing apparatus at the entrance/exit to the Mill View development to reduce travel of mud from the site onto the A1033.
- Following requests from residents

and Parish Councillors Ward Councillors are compiling evidence to put to Yorkshire Water and the Flood Development Team to address draining problems in a range of locations around the village, including Saltaugh Road and Jellison Walk.

## Planning

Following the site meeting with the ERYC Assets Team. Councillors considered and supported the proposal for the demolition of three disused garages on the Northfield Estate. This will create an open parking space, which can be used to relieve the parking problem on Station Road.

Two proposals relating to the disused Mill on Mill Road were considered at the December meeting and supported on condition that the original working of the mill were preserved. The proposals were subsequently withdrawn. No further proposals have been received to date.

An application to create storage space on Berrygate Hill was supported, with the request for landscaping/planting to screen the site.

## Play Equipment

Over the last 6 months Councillors have been considering different options for the repair or replacement of play equipment on Saltaugh Road Amenity Area. After having investigated potential funding streams and considering different options in relation to cost, space and suitability the Council requested further quotes. At the January meeting councillors discussed the relative cost of replacement of a single piece of equipment in comparison to a more comprehensive refurbishment. Applications for grant funding will be required to progress this project. Councillors agreed that a more holistic approach would provide better value in the long term.

## Street Cleaning/ Litter Picking

As many of you will know, Roger our Litter Picker has been very unwell and has had to take a break from work for the time being. The Parish Council would like to thank Roger for his hard work and commitment to the role and wish him better health in 2026.

The Parish Council have decided not to advertise the vacancy for the time being and are taking some time to explore a range of alternative options.

## Streets & Verges

Due to the exceptionally wet weather and the continuing telecommunications works there have been several reports of damage to grass verges around the village. In each case the contractors have been contacted and requests made for care and consideration wherever possible and contributions to repair. Any vehicles on verges at this time of year are likely to cause damage to the verge and underlying utilities, not to mention getting wheels stuck, so the PC ask that everyone continues to avoid driving or parking on grass at any time but especially at this time of year.

## Parking on Saltaugh Road.

The scoping exercise to investigate the possibility of creating additional Parking on Saltaugh Road has progressed to the stage of identifying an area of land, which is currently under informal consideration by ERYC Highways Dept, to advise upon the suitability of the location and requirements for entrance and exit routes. Progressing the project to the next stage, - pre-planning guidance - will be a subject for discussion at the February meeting.
