Parish Council Round Up May 2026

ERYC Ward Councillors Update

In the regular ‘Ward Update’ slot, Cllr Sean McMaster confirmed that:

- Progress on the repair of roads and pavements including Albermarle Road, St Philips Road, Seymour Road, Kelsey Drive and Waudby Garth Road had been made.
- As part of a general flood risk assessment investigations were carried out on the main culvert running down the centre of the village (which carries surface water) by ERYC as a ‘without prejudice’ activity. ERYC were still awaiting update from Yorkshire Water on foul water backing up in certain areas of the village but were due to meet with the Flood Risk Management Team on 5th May.
- In response to Parish Councillors enquiries, ERYC officers confirmed that regular services should include:
 - Public Bins emptied weekly
 - Street Sweeping four times each year
 - Litter picking on main routes once each year

Street Cleaning/ Litter Picking

The Street Cleaning Task force volunteers have begun work in Keyingham and although it is early days the activity appears to be proving successful.

Boyes Lane Recreation Ground Charity

The Trustees of Boyes Lane Recreation Ground Charity held their AGM on 15th April. Reflecting on work and achievements of the Trustees throughout the year the outgoing Chairman, Ricky Hoggard, thanked the Trustees and volunteers for their hard work and support in adding to the planting, and managing a big clean-up of storm damaged structures. Individuals from the Community Payback Scheme also contributed to the work, along with residents, friends and families. An Easter Easter-Egg Hunt was once again held on the recreation Ground, in partnership with the Village Hall and several groups have made enquiries about using the recreation ground to meet during summer months, including the newly formed Men’s Group. Neil Whitelam and David Medforth were elected Chair and Vice Chair of Trustees for year ahead. Volunteers to assist with looking after the newly planted trees during the drier months are always welcome, anyone interested in volunteering please contact Neil or David directly.

Parking issues around the village...

The Parish Council regularly receive feedback from residents sharing concerns about congestion and access issues caused by road traffic. Sometimes this relates to the sheer volume vehicles at certain times of day and in certain areas, sometimes, it is the road conditions and visibility, sometimes it is the speed or size of vehicles and very often it is the way vehicles are parked, causing damage to verges or obstructing access. These matters are a focus of debate at every meeting and the partner agencies are frequently consulted to assist in addressing the problems.

Each time parking is discussed some of the same issues remain unresolved, due mainly to the width of the streets, the volume of traffic using them, and the number of vehicles per household in areas where off street parking is limited. The Parish Council is very aware of the combination of living in the country, (where the main industry is agriculture) and the main commuter route into Hull, which runs through the centre of the village.

Unfortunately there are no ‘quick and easy solutions,’ some small improvements are possible, such as a few more parking spaces on Northfield, new lights and CCTV at the current road crossing, a further road crossing under proposal; marshalling of match-day traffic on Saltaugh Road and polite notices appealing for cooperation in high traffic, congested areas. ERYC Highways team advise that creating restrictions, for example yellow lines, in one area often leads to a greater problem in another location. There have been some concerns raised about access for emergency vehicles to certain areas of the village and the police have been contacted to approach individuals directly where vehicles were obstructing access.

The Parish Council does consider the impact on roads and infrastructure of every proposed new development, large and small, and exercises its ‘voice’ to the greatest extent possible.

Allotments

Allotment tenancies have been renewed for the year ahead and some of the people whose names were on our waiting list have taken plots for the first time. Once the new tenancy agreements are issued, we are likely to have a couple of vacant plots left so if you are interested please contact the Clerk or Cllr Ray Lawton.

Councillor Vacancy

There is still a vacancy on the Parish Council – if you are over 18, live or work in Keyingham and are interested in helping make a difference your local community we would love to hear from you!

The Parish Council would especially welcome interest from people involved with young people and families, either as a parent, carer or volunteer.

The Parish Council now has a membership of individuals with a wide range of backgrounds and skill sets, including Education, Construction, Transport, Law, Leisure, Local Government and Business, many of whom continue to work within local companies who support the rural economy.
