



Parish Council 'Round-up'

October - December 2024 Road Safety in Keyingham

The final stage of the works to improve road safety in the centre of the village, the siting of the CCTV cameras was completed in the autumn and CCTV monitoring is now active in all three locations. Humberside Police can access the data captured and have recently established a protocol for obtaining recordings to assist in in crime detection and prevention. The Parish Council, in partnership with Keyingham School, applied to ERYC for an extension of the 20mph zone as part of a pilot initiative to investigate the impact of reducing speed limits. The list of locations was recently published and unfortunately Keyingham was not selected for the trial. The opportunity afforded by 'school streets' parking and access restrictions was also investigated however it was agreed that it would not be possible to apply the restrictions in Keyingham because of the resident's requirements for access to and from Russell Drive throughout the day and closing it to traffic at school start and finish times would be unmanageable.

Civic Service

Keyingham and Ottringham Parish Councils, in partnership with Keyingham Primary School Student Council. hosted a special Civic Service in St Nicholas Church, Keyingham on 13th October led by Rev. Simon Clark. The Service was attended by Councillors and residents of both Parishes and guests from neighbouring towns and Parishes. Members of Keyingham Primary School Student Council offered a warm welcome at the start of the Ser-

vice and helped with refreshments afterwards. The service was attended by Keyingham Scouts who also participated in making the event, which was themed around Service to our Community, so special for everyone. A big thankyou to everyone one involved!

Remembrance Sunday Service

The Remembrance Day service held in St Nicholas Church, on 10th November, led by Rev. Janice Sharp. In attendance were Standard Bearers from the Royal British Legion, Kevingham Scouts and Guides, Ward Cllr Sean McMaster and representatives of Keyingham Parish Council. Readings were offered by Chairman Cllr David Clark and Vice Chairman Cllr Melvyn Smith. Two minutes Silence were observed in the church Grounds at 11.00am followed by the laying of wreathes on behalf of all branches of the Armed Services, Civic and Civilian organisations and Youth organisations including Keyingham Primary School, Kevingham Guides and Scouts. Thank you to the Churchwardens of St Nicholas Church and to everyone who participated in this annual service of remembrance.

Keyingham Village Hall

Thanks to committee members and volunteers the Village Hall recent improvements include new fire alarms and evacuation procedures. An Electronic Notice Board has been added to the window looking out onto Station Road with up-to-date information on planned events and activities. The electrical connection, tree, lights and installation were supported by grant funding via the 'Do it for East Yorkshire' funding stream. Grateful thanks to everyone involved in this lovely addition to Christmas festivities in Kevingham. Unfortunately, only one day after the 'switch on' we experienced unusually high winds which resulted in the tree being blown over. Everyone is hopeful that the tree can soon be restored so that we can continue to enjoy it in the lead up to Christmas!

Boyes Lane Recreation Ground

At the Trustees meeting in November, members welcomed the two staff including the Assistant Headteacher from Oakfield School as the first stage in a new partnership with the School. Oakfield pupils will be helping with grounds maintenance on the Recreation Ground on Wednesdays each week from November.
