Parish Council 'Round-up'

February - March 2023

Road Safety in Keyingham

Following the site meeting in January the Parish Council have received updates on progress towards the commencement of works on the main road and road crossing from ERYC Traffic Management Team and Ward Councillors.

Modifications have been made to the original design for the Road Crossing, informed by further traffic surveys and also by the legal requirements for the width of pavements to allow disabled access/accessibility. Updates will be shared via the Parish Council website as and when they are received.

Antisocial Behaviour on the Village Green

At the March meeting the PC members were pleased to receive the news that the second bid for funds to address antisocial behaviour in three specific areas of the village had been successful! Depending upon the value of the funds secured it may be possible to provide CCTV surveillance in the area if the Village Green, Saltaugh Road Amenity Area and Main Street.

Keyingham Village Hall

The Parish Council continues to support the efforts of the Village Hall Committee to stimulate use and engagement for the Village Hall.

Following repairs to the heating system and kitchen equipment the Hall has hosted 'Warm Hub' events, Film shows, 'Bake & Beverage' (delicious home-made cakes and a cuppa) adding to the already successful Folk Club, Mens Group, Scouts and various private events bookings. The Village Hall Committee are currently gathering quotes for repairs to the roof as the next main priority.

Keyingham Primary School 'Green Space' Project

At the February meeting of members of the Keyingham Primary School Student Council, accompanied by Headteacher Mrs V. White; School Manager Mrs L. Richardson; parents and grandparents, presented a request for support for their 'Green Spaces' Project. Pupils gave a short presentation and handed out leaflets about their project, which were very well received. The Parish Council pledged their support for the project including making funds available towards the purchase of a commemorative bench for HM King Charles III coronation,

and assistance with planting of shrubs and flower beds, bird feeders and landscaping of the area outside the school to create an accessible ‘green space.’ Chairman of the Council, Cllr David Clark, thanked the members of the School Council for their presentation and commitment to their community. Landscaping and tree planting begins on 24th March – ‘watch this green space’ take shape!

Cemetery

Work on the cemetery fencing to prevent rabbit damage to floral tributes and planting will begin during the last week in March. All normal service will continue throughout the work which will be carried out as sensitively as possible.

Allotments

The new ‘Gardening Year’ will begin in April, almost all the tenancies are continuing, however there are a small number of plots available for rent. Anyone interested in taking an allotment please contact the Parish Clerk or Cllr Ray Lawton.

Thanks to the grant which we were able to secure from East Riding of Yorkshire Council, we have been able to re-invigorate the use of the village hall. The replacement of the boiler and servicing of the heating system has allowed us to continue the events which were already scheduled in the village hall as well as adding the new events of a monthly film show and a warm hub on a Friday afternoon. It is hoped that the increased usage of the village hall will continue after the end of March when the grant finishes. Two extra films have been booked (details on the front page). It is important for the survival of the village hall that villagers support the events.

The Village Hall Committee are always looking for new events and a recently held Pre Loved clothing sale was well attended. There is to be a further pre Loved Clothing Sale on the 1st July. It is hoped that the film shows will be back again in September.
