Minutes of the meeting of the Keyingham Parish Council held in the Village Hall on Tuesday 15th April 2025.

1. Public Participation: None

1.1 <u>Ward Update</u> Cllr McMaster offered a ward update which included a verbal presentation from Cllr Leo Hammond, Deputy Police and Crime Commissioner.

Humberside Police now employ 2,300 Police Officers and 58 PCSO. There has been an increase in awareness and subsequent reporting of 'crimes against the person' including domestic abuse. Cllr Hammond described a focus for policing of crime prevention and support for the victims of crime, the 'Auto Speed Watch' Scheme which detects speed but also 'spots' untaxed vehicles, HGV over permitted laden weight.

Speed Indicator devices were also discussed alongside the availability of new roadside speed monitoring and recording devices which offered the additional capability to record infringements and issue warning letters culminating in fines for repeat offences. The cost of the cameras is £750.00 per camera with 50% funding available for Parishes. Cllr Hammond described 'Operation Snap' spotting dangerous driving, not necessarily speeding, but driving without due care and attention type of offences. Cllr Hammond also explained that dashcams and doorbell Cameras (over- looking the highway) were being provided free of charge on agreement to share/upload footage. The legal position regarding the use of electric bikes on highways and walkways in towns and parishes was clarified. A Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO)

Can be applied for, banning electric bikes from city/town centres. Drones already in use to monitor rural offences such as Hare Coursing are employed to police PSPO's.

In relation to speeding Cllr Hammond explained that an advisory speed limit can be introduced without change to bylaws and that Community Speed Watch can be active on any road where there is a 'safe place to stand' and the speed limit is 40 mph or below. It was confirmed that parking vehicles blocking the pavement is dealt with by ERYC.

Cllr Hammond and Cllr McMaster answered questions on the role of the new Mayor and the forthcoming Mayoral elections.

Cllr McMaster reported that 'agreement in principle' had been reached regarding the positioning of a road crossing close to the Ship PH.

There was no further update on the potential future use of the land occupied by the garages on Northfield for parking.

'Project Gigabyte' – the installation of fibre broadband, using existing infrastructure, will benefit Keyingham. New (shorter) posts will only be installed where there are no suitable existing structures to attach equipment. **Noted.**

Cllr Clark thanked Cllrs Hammond and McMaster for their attendance & updates.

3.4 <u>Pruning of Trees, St Nicholas Church Grounds.</u> It was resolved to go ahead with pruning dead branches of the Tree on the boundary of Rosedale House, for safety reasons, and request estimates from two contractors for pruning of the Trees in the general area including the Village Green as may be deemed to be appropriate by specialist contractors in negotiation with St Nicholas Church PCC. **Action Clerk.**
